Norwood Viviano: Re-Cast Cities

December 15, 2022 - March 12, 2023

Norwood Viviano combines 3D computer modeling and printing technology with glass blowing and casting to explore the dynamics of community and manufacturing. His semi-transparent cast glass sculptures re-create cities as three-dimensional maps merged with symbols of industry. Miniature cities span steel girders, tabletops, stacks of newspapers, and a collection of tumblers, revealing the ways in which a city's industry defines its character, both physically and culturally. This exhibition will be the largest showing of Viviano's Re-Cast Cities series to date and will include the premiere of Re-Casting Muskegon along with loans from the Grand Rapids Art Museum and the Toledo Museum of Art.

From Glass to Paper:

The Harvey Littleton Printmaking Legacy

December 15, 2022 - February 6, 2023

Harvey Littleton is famed as a founding figure of the modern studio glass movement. He was also an avid printmaker and developed the printmaking technique of vitreography - using glass plates to reproduce various traditional print methods such as etching and lithography. Littleton established Littleton Studios in the early 1980s in western North Carolina and teamed with master printer Judith O'Rourke to explore the new media. Artists from around the world were invited to print at the studio. Some were experienced printmakers while others were painters, sculptors, and glass artists. John Littleton and Kate Vogel, heirs to Harvey Littleton, have gifted to the Muskegon Museum of Art a collection of 27 prints produced by the studio during its existence. From Glass to Paper is the premiere of this collection to our public.

Artists represented in this collection include master printmaker Warrington Colescott, painter/sculptor Italo Scanga, and glass artists Rick Beck, Harvey Littleton, Dale Chihuly, and Ann Wolff. Glass objects from the MMA's own collection accompany the prints.

Jonathan Thunder: Maamawi

September 29, 2022 - January 8, 2023

Jonathan Thunder creates paintings and animated films that speak to popular culture, modern society, and his Ojibwe heritage. Thunder is interested in ongoing contrasts and fractures in our society, even as we maintain individual connections and shared experiences. Inspired by imagery from media, cartoons, entertainment, and Ojibwe traditions, Thunder offers his own unique, often surreal take on the "good side and less than pristine side of the human journey."

Jonathan Thunder: Maamawi is organized by the Muskegon Museum of Art and includes paintings from a new body of work and short animated films. "Maamawi" is the Ojibwe word for "together," and addresses our shared humanity.

Jonathan Thunder (born 1977) is a member of the Red Lake Ojibwe Nation and grew up in the Minneapolis/St. Paul region. He attended the Institute of American Indian Arts in Santa Fe, NM and studied Visual Effects and Motion Graphics at the Art Institute International in Minneapolis, MN. His work has appeared in local, regional, and national exhibitions and his short films have earned several awards. Thunder is a 2020 recipient of the Pollock-Krasner Foundation Award for painting. His paintings and films were included in the 2020-2021 exhibition *The Art of People: Contemporary Anishinaabe Artists* by Muskegon Museum of Art and Grand Valley State University Art Gallery (with guest curator Jason Quigno).

FOA has gifted over 70 significant works of art to the permanent collection, created an annual lecture series, financially supported exhibitions, and most recently donated funds to purchase furnishings and art supplies for the MMA's new art classroom expansion. This scholarship is named in honor of Alice Smith, who served as the first President of Friends of Art in 1923.

The Muskegon Museum of Art's iconic Edward Hopper painting, New York Restaurant, is currently on display at the Whitney Museum of American Art in New York City as part of the exhibition Edward Hopper's New York. The exhibition focuses on Hopper's relationship to the city through not only his drawings, prints, and paintings, but also his archives journals, photographs, letters, and a collection of ticket stubs, playbills, and the like. Our own painting was selected as an early example of the artist's interests in the city around him and is paired with a painting from the Metropolitan Museum of Art of the same setting, decades later.

Edward Hopper's subtle observations of American life made him a pivotal figure in the development of American art. He studied under Robert Henri and Kenneth Hayes Miller at the New York School of Art from 1900 to 1906 and made three trips to Europe but did not enroll for formal study. He was included in the 1913 Armory Show but afterwards abandoned painting for the next decade, making a living as a commercial artist and refining his art through etchings and watercolors. In the early 1920s a watercolor, The Mansard Roof, was exhibited and purchased by the Brooklyn Art Museum. It laid out what would become the hallmarks of Hopper's work: a precise sense of location; clear, harsh light; strong geometric elements; and a sense of loneliness and melancholy.

New York Restaurant comes out of Hopper's return to painting in the 1920s. While the scene is crowded, the woman in the red hat seems removed and distant, uninvolved with the man who sits with her. Hopper spoke of this painting in a letter to the Muskegon Museum of Art dated January 9, 1937:

The picture "New York Restaurant" was painted about 1922 – not later at any rate. In a specific and concrete sense, the idea was to attempt to make visual the crowded glamour of a New York restaurant during the noon hour. I am hoping that ideas less easy to define have, perhaps, crept in also.

The compositional elements of New York Restaurant presage the layouts of his later masterpieces Chop Suey and Automat, making our painting an important work in understanding the development of Hopper's career.
